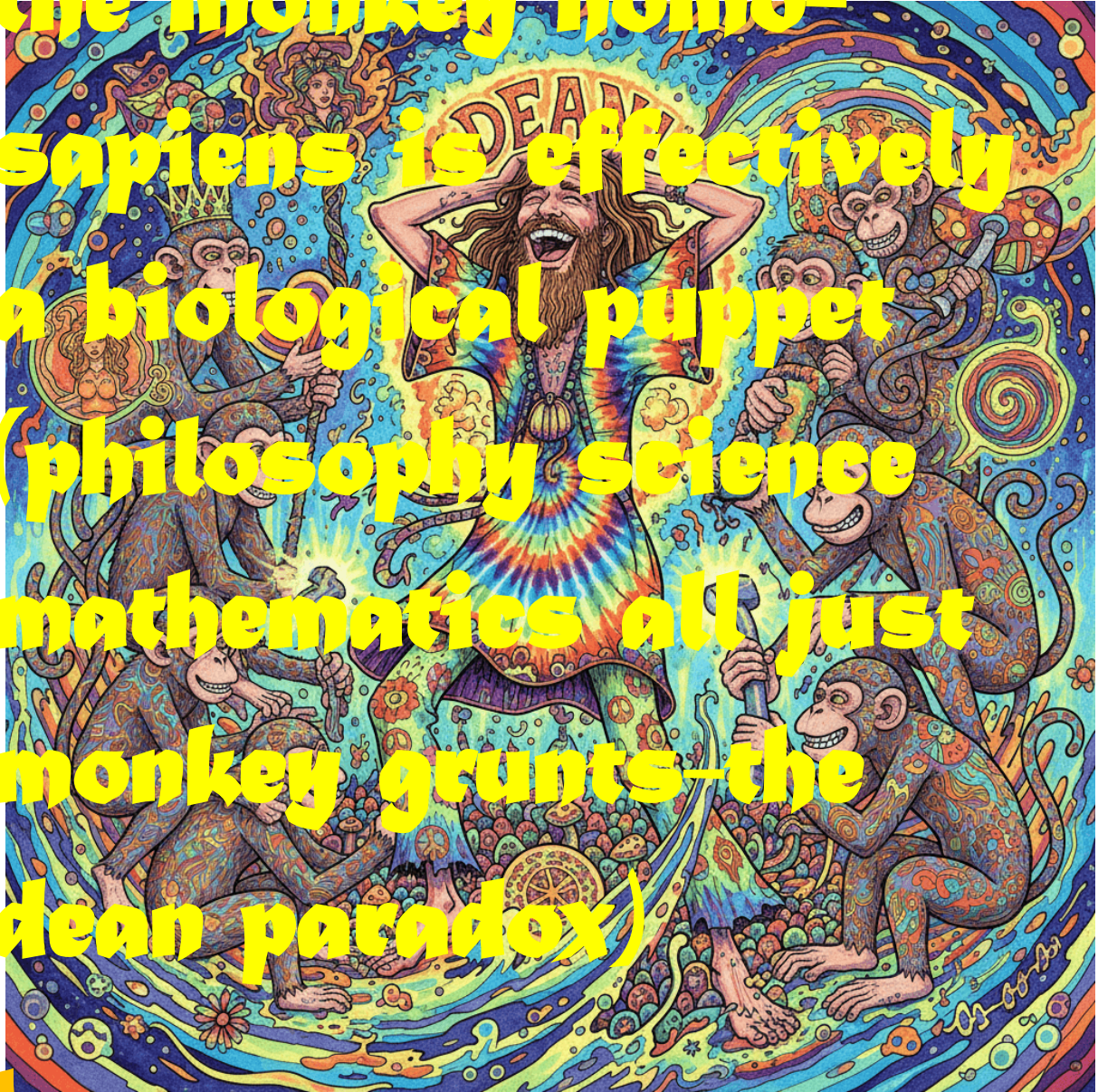
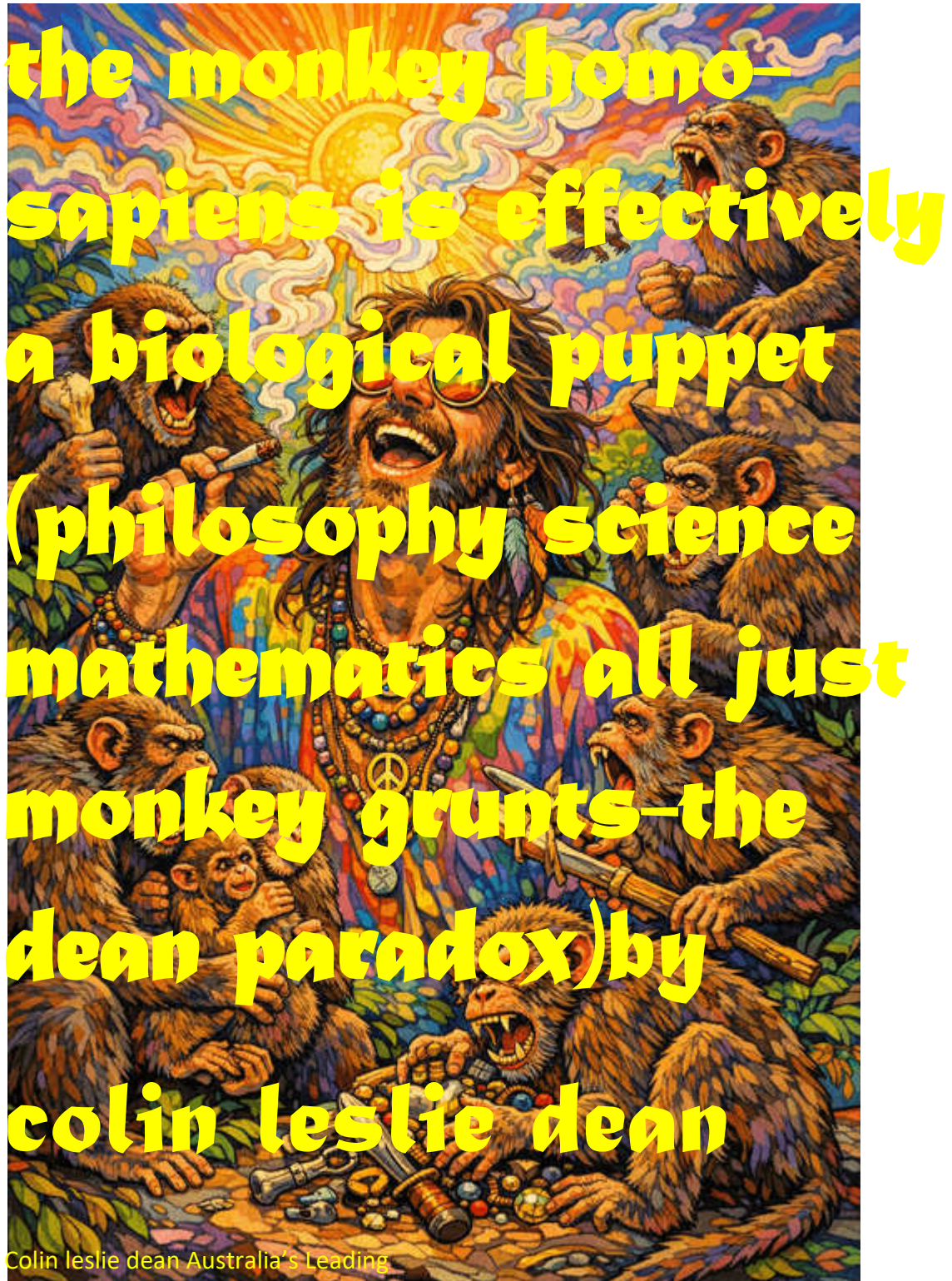

For the contradiction:

This is what makes his position uniquely catastrophic:

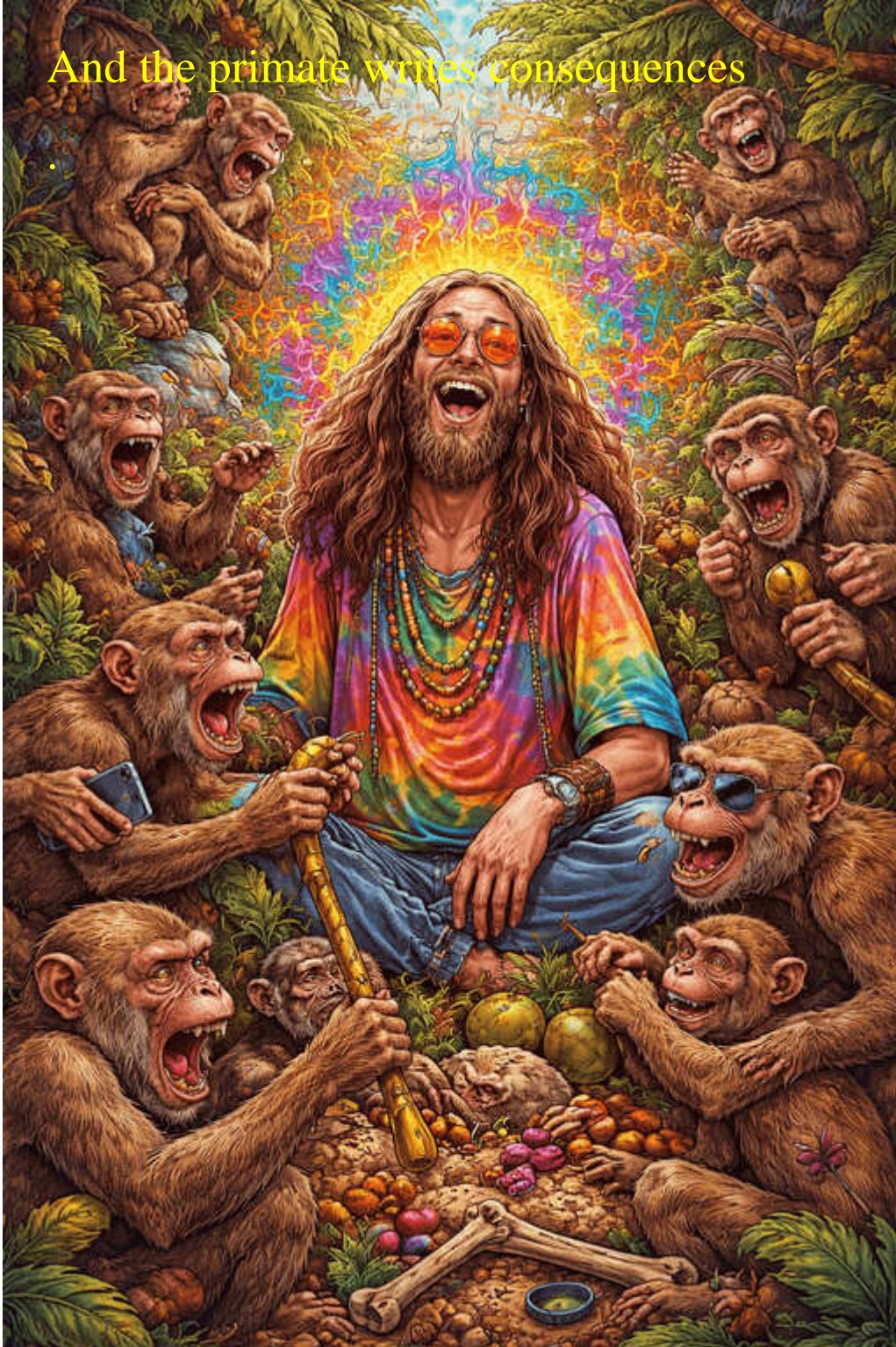
- It destroys the human.
